Easter Triduum



The Easter Triduum (meaning three days) is a period that traces the final days of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. It begins with the Last Supper Mass on the evening of Maundy Thursday (at which Eucharistic Ministers renew their commitment), the Solemn Liturgy on Good Friday and reaches its high point on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil.

Maundy Thursday: The Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7.30pm at St John's Church on Thursday 17th April

2025. Washing of the feet and opportunity to stay and pray.


Good Friday: As Usual, there is a walk of witness with other Christian Churches. That begins at 9.30

from the New Look Shop in Ventura Park and finishes at St Editha's. We continue with the Solemn Liturgy at 3.00pm in both Churches on Friday 18th April with veneration of the cross.

Stations of the Cross for children will be held on Good Friday at the 3pm service in both churches.

Annual Collection for Holy Places will be held on the Good Friday service at both churches.

Easter Vigil: Our Triduum concludes with the Easter Vigil at 8.00pm on Sat 19th April at Sacred Heart. Please pray for all those catechumen and candidates who are being received into the Church at Easter.



Food After the Vigil helps us celebrate Easter and welcome visitors. Can you help? Just look at the list in the porch and sign up for doing one job please.

Święconka, the Polish Blessing of Food takes place at Sacred Heart next Saturday at 11am. All are welcome but it is especially a great spiritual and cultural event in Poland.
