

**The Assisted Dying Bill** is due before parliament soon. People have strong and often emotional feelings about this. None of us want to see people suffer. Cardinal Nicholls spoke about this on the radio last weekend. His letter is printed and available in the Church porch. It is short and definitely worth reading.

No matter how many safeguards there are, every country introducing this sort of 'right' sees it being extended and broadened. This has led to some horrendous cases. The Cardinal also makes the point that the right to die can become a 'duty to die'. **Please take a copy and read it.** 

If you feel that you can, please write to your MP since it will be people with disabilities, frail elderly, people with mental health problems, all so vulnerable, who will feel most threatened. Many doctors will also feel they are being put in an impossible position, trained to heal, asked to kill.
