Communion Preparation for Children at Non-Catholic Schools continue Monday 25th March at 6.00pm-7.00pm.



The Craft Group Thank you to everyone who supported the Craft Groups sale of their incredible work last Sunday. They collected over £400 for the parish. Well done.

The Craft Group meet every fortnight in the Modwen room from 1pm-3pm doing lots of different crafts such as paper folding, sewing, macrame, collage etc. You don't have to be an expert! The next craft club meeting is on Tuesday 9th April. We hope to see you there.

Church Giving: We are doing the accounts for 2023 and will present these in due course. Thank-you for supporting the parish. 'Loose money' on the collection has increased. It was $\pounds700$ last week and included $\pounds5$, $\pounds10$ and $\pounds20$ notes.

Can people who give this way please swap to standing orders? For us, it means no counting, banking or security issues. That way, it can also be gift aided (government adds 25% from taxpayers to increase the donation). If all our 'loose' money was gift-aided it would increase our collection by **£7,000 per annum** at no cost to you. That's a big increase and would cover a loss we made last year. Forms can be found in the church porch.

This is followed with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday at St John's (7.30pm) and Good Friday liturgy at 3.00pm in both churches. There will also be a walk of witness on Good Friday starting at New Look on Ventura Park. We meet there at 10.30am and walk to St Editha's for prayers.

Easter Vigil

This eleventh century 'Exultet roll' has illustrations of bees (candle made from beeswax) to accompany the Paschal vigil text. St. John Chrysostom wrote: *The bee is... honoured... not because it labours, but because it labours for others.*

This year we are receiving 23 people into the Church. These are men and women of all ages from our community who have been preparing for 7 months and longer. Some will be baptised, many confirmed and making their first holy communion. It is a joyous occasion for them but also for the parish. Please pray for them to experience the power of God's spirit and to grow strong in faith.
